Dean's Message

Education! Opportunities for life-long education! Life-long education leading to recognized certification in organ and choral proficiency. Framed certificates on your office wall. SPC, CAGO, ChM, AAGO, FAGO behind your signature.

In the immediately past decades, professional certification in several professional fields has become more and more important as college and university programs have been diminished or even eliminated, including organ and sacred music programs. Opportunities for professional development and renewal disappear, and in certain fields, including organ and choral music in religious and educational institutions, a decline of professional leadership.

Thanks to the wisdom and vision of the founding fathers of the American Guild of Organists, one the stated goals of the Guild is to offer life-long education opportunities for those seeking to develop proficiency in organ and choral music leadership in religious and education institutions as well as personal and professional growth. These goals are partially accomplished through the Guild's certification program, beginning with the SPC and ChM, followed sequentially by the CAGO, AAGO, and FAGO certification.

The Service Playing Certificate (SPC) and Colleague American Guild of Organists (CAGO) certify performance skills at the console, including voluntary repertoire, transposition, sight reading, and improvisational skills. The Associate American Guild of Organists (AAGO) and Fellow American Guild of Organists (FAGO) require extensive performance skill development as well as extensive knowledge of theory, music history, and composition. The ChM requires considerable knowledge of choral literature in addition to developed vocal and directing skills.

Through publications, articles in TAO, and resources available at national headquarters, the Guild offers many resources to candidates for any of the certificates. Local chapters appoint an *Continued on page 3*

Success! January Jubilee

Team work! Omaha AGO JANUARY JUBILEE was terrifically successful because of team work within the chapter.

Team work was evident when the JANUARY JUBILEE committee, comprised of Ann Warner Spangler, Joan Ebersold, Jerry Brabec, Marty Wheeler Burnett, Dr. Wayne Kallstrom, Greg Johnson, and Mark Kurtz met early in the spring. Members of the committee proceeded to recruit presenters, organized promotional materials, facilitated business transactions, recruited fellow chapter members for various responsibilities, always with visible team-work observed across the membership of the Chapter.

Team work was especially evident in organization of materials for workshop handouts, items gathered for the packets, and preparing a mailing of more than 700 brochures. Members work well with Rosemary Paul, who designed the promotional flyers and the program booklets. Chapter members moved tables, chairs, handbells, organ consoles, pianos, and dividers at Saint John Lutheran both before and after the Jubilee.

Member Spotlight: Dr. Wayne Kallstrom

In 1962 having determined that he would be a music major, Kallstrom enrolled at Drake University, Des Moines, IA, as a Church Music major (organ) studying with the renowned pedagogue, Russell Saunders. While at Drake he was awarded a Drake University Scholarship as well as the Central Iowa Chapter American Guild of Organists' Scholarship (1965.) He was a member of Phi Eta Sigma Freshman Fraternity, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia Fraternity and Pi Kappa Alpha Honorary Fraternity.

Following graduation from Drake (1966,) he auditioned and was accepted for graduate work at the Eastman School of Music (Rochester, NY) where he earned the MM and DMA degrees in Performance and Church music, studying with the gifted performer and teacher, David Craighead.

Dr. Kallstrom's teaching/performing career began in 1971 and has continued to the present time. He has held teaching positions at Whitworth College, Spokane WA; Oklahoma State University, Stillwater, OK; Minot State College, Minot, ND; and Northwestern Oklahoma State U., Alva, OK. Since 1982, he has taught at the University of Nebraska-Omaha, and until recently at the College of Saint Mary and Metropolitan Community College, Omaha.

He has served as organist at St. Luke's Lutheran, Omaha, Trinity Lutheran, Des Moines, St. John's Lutheran, Des Moines, First Presbyterian, East Rochester, NY, Parkside Methodist, East Rochester, NY, Messiah Lutheran, Spokane, WA and for the past 33 years at Dundee Presbyterian, Omaha.

Kallstrom is a member of the Omaha Chapter AGO and for 28 years served as Editor of the monthly newsletter, *The Windchest*. He has presented programs for the Omaha Music Teachers' Association: "From Pianist to Organist" (1998,) and "Sopranos of the Twentieth Century" (2004.) For the Omaha Chapter AGO, he presented a program,

"Trumpets and Other Toys." (2001.)

He has played an annual faculty organ recital at the University of Nebraska-Omaha since 1989 and has performed on the East and West coasts and in the southwestern parts of the US.

In 2008 he accompanied the choir from the College of Saint Mary to Italy and served as organist at masses at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome and at the Basilica of St. Francis in Assisi. He also accompanied public concerts at St. Ignatius Loyola, Rome and at St. Mark's Anglican Church, Florence.

In 2014 he again served as organist for the CSM choir on its tour of Ireland where masses were sung at St. Patrick's Cathedral, Armagh and St. Mary's Pro-Cathedral, Dublin.



Member Spotlight: The Rev. Jerald Brabec


Rev. W. Jerald Brabec

Rev. W. Jerald Brabec, tenor, is an Ordained Deacon on the clergy staff at Omaha St. Paul United Methodist Church where he serves as Minister of Worship. His responsibilities include the overseeing of music preparation for the congregation of 650.

Awarded the Master of Music degree from the University of Nebraska, he studied choral conducting with Dr. Cina Crisara and Dr. Z. Randall Stroope. As a chorister of the acclaimed Robert Shaw Festival Chorus at Carnegie Hall, he sang for five years under the baton of the late Robert Shaw, was selected one of six participants in the Alice Parker Melodius Accord Fellowship Program and continues his conducting studies with Ms. Parker each January in New York.

Jerry is an active musical director for the Omaha Theater Company for Children at the Rose. He also serves as music director for the nationally acclaimed Rose Brigade, one of the award winning offerings of the "Broadway at the Rose" program. In June 2010, Jerry premiered the production of "Two Gentleman" of Verona" for Omaha's Shakespeare in the Parks in the position of musical director. Formerly, Jerry taught at the high school level for Council Bluffs Community Schools, served as associate artistic director of the Omaha Clarion Chorale, artistic director for the Kanesville Chorus and Renaissance Faire of the Midlands. He frequently sings in area theatre and commercial settings, and is a member of Omaha-based Caberet Theatre.
