From the Dean...

"TEAMWORK"

"Work Place Harmony: Identifying Tools for the development of Good Collaboration in Ministry—WORKSHOP I" is the title of the chapter's January program, scheduled on Tuesday, January 16. The workshop facilitator, Jodi Korth, together with the Omaha AGO Clergy-Musician Task Force, is developing an extended program that is certain to offer significant encouragement regarding clergy -musician collaboration.

The Clergy-Musician Task Force is comprised of four Omaha AGO chapter members and four clergy with whom the members presently collaborate, or have collaborated in the past. The Task Force, under the direction of program director Jodi Korth, is a unique team of clergy and musicians that will offer many examples, ideas, and opportunities for development and growth of clergy-musician teams throughout the community.

In preparation for serving on the task force as a musician, background reading has provided some information that may be of value to chapter members as we anticipate our "Work Place Harmony..." program.

Consider team work. In *RIVALS* or a *TEAM?* (Eileen Guenther: MorningStar Publishers: 2012), Guenther states team work is regarded as "the best, if not the only way to build success." People are much more interested in setting and achieving goals if they participate in the defining and implementation of the goals, deciding how the goals will be achieved. In church work, there is one single goal, which is effective ministry, serving others. The bottom line is measured not in corporate profits, "but in the ability of the church to serve God the Father Almighty and minister to God's people."

What are the qualities clergy and musicians share as a basis for team building? Again, referring to Dr. Guenther: *Qualities Clergy and Musicians Share as a Basis for Team Building:*

Highly intuitive: developing finely tuned intuition leading to creative decisions based on information described as subjective;

Highly motivated: often described as a "workaholic," working long hours, addressing a variety of demands:

A sense of call: Clergy are generally as having been called to their work; musicians are often not seen the same way in terms of a vocational call. A calling seeks the common good of those served, not private gain;

Nurturing: Clergy nurture congregations; musicians nurture musicians: singers and instrumentalists;

Conflict avoiding and people-pleasing: neither clergy nor musicians should pleasing others be the overriding goal of their lives;

Under-compensated: Clergy, with considerable education and training, are often underpaid in comparison to the salaries of many other professionals. Musicians, often part-time or voluntary, hold other part-time positions; volunteer musicians may develop attitudes that are not appropriate, nor encourage positive team work with clergy and other leadership.

Publicly evaluated weekly: both clergy and musician are evaluated weekly, creating continuous pressure, never to be underestimated.
